The Jurassic Coast- Setting

The Jurassic Coast is home to an array of exemplary geological features and formations, palaeontological remains of internationally scientific importance and textbook coastal processes.

Coupled with this outstanding Earth History spanning over 185 million years along 95 miles of coastline, is a rich local heritage and fascinating social history. The natural resources available here created the perfect place for early settlement and continues to provide a valuable resource for the communities of the Jurassic Coast.

For centuries, budding geologists and fossil collectors have gravitated towards the fossil-rich cliffs and beaches, lending itself to a wealth of scientific understanding that stems from the shores of the Jurassic Coast.

This year, 2022, marks the 20th anniversary of the Jurassic Coast being inscribed as a World Heritage Site.

Context and Purpose

The Jurassic Coast Trust is the Independent Charity responsible for the protection and conservation of the Dorset and East Devon Coast world Heritage Site, known as 'The Jurassic Coast'.

In 2017, responsibility for Site management was passed from Dorset and Devon Councils to the Trust who now manage and deliver World Heritage Site Management and programme delivery; advocacy and external relationships, governance, risk, legal and financial management and management of the Jurassic Coast staff team.

The Charity has a fulltime CEO who leads a dedicated team of salaried staff, who are aided by very committed volunteers and delivery partners. There is also a team of Trustees led by a Chair with a wide range of skills including in governance, conservation, palaeontology, communications, strategy and public service. The Trust also co-ordinates working groups for specific work which feeds into main Board decisions.

The role of a Trustee is to work with the Chair and other members of the Board to determine the Trust's strategy and ensure that it delivers on its charitable objectives and long-term mission. The Board is ultimately responsible for the organisation's viability, strategic direction and legal responsibilities. In addition, Trustees should be willing to use their specific skills and expertise to support the Board and Senior Management Team in its decision-making, and will be ambassadors for the Trust, always acting in its best interests. They will also be able to form sound and balanced independent views, and to challenge in a constructive and collegial manner.

- Provide strategic oversight of conservation projects and implementation, particularly related to the Jurassic Coast Collection project and the delivery of the 2020-2025 Partnership Plan.
- Champion the use of data and academic research in Board discussions, and in driving the delivery and improvement of project management.
- Draw on your networks to support our work.

- Professional experience of working in the field of earth sciences or heritage, i.e., in academia, the museum or heritage sector.
- Experience of working at a senior management / leadership level.
- Ability to work as part of a team, learning together.
- Ability to work at a strategic level whilst understanding the detail and complexities of delivery, and the influencing skills needed to bring staff and stakeholders along with plans.
- Strong communicator.
- Ability to analyse risks and opportunities and take a balanced approach to both.
